Connecting Communities

The third year of our member fiber to the home project is in full swing. Mastec was the winning bidder to place fiber infrastructure in the communities of Arcadia, Asbury, Mulberry and Weir. This project will convert over 1,500 members to fiber and will be our largest project to date by covering over 200 square miles of territory at a cost just under \$11 million. This investment in our Coop's future will ensure our members will have access to the fastest internet speeds available anywhere for decades to come.

We have also been busy expanding into new non-member communities to ensure our Coop keeps growing by developing new and diverse sources of revenue. The Pittsburg, KS build will be completed late this summer making Pittsburg one of the largest cities in Kansas to have 100% of its city limits having access to gigabit speed internet. We are also building out the city of Ft. Scott over the next couple years.

telemarketers will be required to
remove your number from their
call lists and may not call you.

calls from political organizations,
charities, telephone surveyors, or
companies with which you have an
existing business relationship.

Craw-Kan Director Positions

Craw-Kan Telephone Cooperative has a board of nine directors each serving a three year term. Elections are staggered, according to our By-Laws whereby three director positions are up for election each year at the Craw-Kan Annual Meeting held in October. A nominating committee, appointed by the current directors in August, will meet in early September to make nominations for the three positions to be voted on at the Annual Meeting of Members in October. Voting at the Annual Meeting is by secret ballot. The By-Laws allow nominations from the floor of the Annual Meeting and any member desiring to vote for a candidate nominated from the floor at the meeting shall write in the name of such candidate beneath the candidates nominated by the committee. Each voting member of the Cooperative present in person at the meeting shall be entitled to vote for three candidates. The three candidates receiving the highest number of votes at such meeting shall be declared elected as Directors. For more detailed information on the election of Directors see Article IV of the By-Laws in the front of the Directory.

The Craw-Kan By-Laws state in Section 4.3 "Any member shall be eligible to be nominated, elected and remain a Director of cooperative who:

- · Resides in the geographic area served by the Cooperative.
- Is not an employee of cooperative or in any way financially interested in a competing enterprise or a business engaged in selling communication services or communication supplies or maintaining communication facilities. However, the Board may grant exceptions for 'de minimus' competing enterprises.
- Is not closely related to an incumbent Director or an employee of Cooperative.
- Whose election would not establish a majority of directors to represent any one exchange area.
- Whose election would not establish a majority of more than one director to represent either the rural or urban areas.

If you would be interested in having the nominating committee consider you for nomination, your application will be presented to the nomination committee. Please send the following information to the General Manager, P.O. Box 100, Girard, KS 66743 no later than September 11, 2019:

Information Required:

Name, address and telephone number.

Work experience.

Short paragraph stating why you would be interested in being a director.

Is Gigabit Right for Me?

Now that several exchanges are (or are almost) 100% fiber, we are often asked, should I upgrade to gigabit internet? Without diving into a bunch of technical details – here are a few reasons you might want to upgrade to gigabit internet if you have been upgraded to a fiber optic connection:

- Gigabit supports multiple devices. Remember almost every electronic device in the home can now connect to Wi-Fi, not just computers and laptops. Phones, tablets, TVs, radios, security systems, security cameras and doorbells all use the internet and create traffic. Gigabit is essentially a bigger highway, allowing you to avoid traffic jams!
- Gigabit eliminates buffering. Streaming HD video, audio, video chat, and services like Netflix, Hulu and YouTube use a LOT of bandwidth. Gigabit allows multiple devices to watch video at the same time without the pauses known as "buffering". Buffering is the time when the video pauses because you are watching video faster than your connection can download the files.
- Gigabit moves large files quickly. Many new video games require HUGE files to be downloaded and can literally take hours to complete. With a gigabit connection, these files can be downloaded in minutes rather than hours. All large files – movies, music, games and software downloads come in much faster and do not disrupt other users connected.
